
Knights of Columbus NEWS

The Catholic Archdiocese of Edmonton <u>Catholic Pulse Survey</u> <u>on MAiD:</u> <u>Survey Results</u>

An informal online survey within the Archdiocese Objective: To uncover prevailing sentiments on MAiD

Our Church is: Countercultural

Our survey results are a stark contrast from the national surveys where a majority of respondents support MAiD. Based on this, we can conclude that we are a countercultural Church. However, Catholics who oppose MAiD were not able to prevent their loved ones from going through with it.

Compassionate

People who are in favor of MAiD are coming from a place of compassion and empathy for those who are suffering. Compassion is also at the core of Catholic Social Teaching in the person of Jesus Christ who died and resurrected to redeem human life. However, people who are in favor of MAiD very much feel that the Church cares more about following the teachings rather than empathizing with the suffering.

Compelling

Majority of respondents are compelled and strongly influenced by their Catholic Faith in terms of how they live their lives. However, they would like to see more compelling messages from Church leaders on the topic of MAiD

SUMMARY OF ISSUES AND ACTION POINTS We are a COUNTERCULTURAL CHURCH.

How do we live this out? Equip Catholics to be effective witnesses in their families, parishes, workplaces and communities to the true hope and dignity offered by Our Lord Jesus Christ to those who are suffering and dying.

We are a COMPASSIONATE CHURCH.

How do we demonstrate this in the public square? Highlight how the Catholic Church has been helping people to "die with dignity" since its founding, offering hope, mercy and love to those who are suffering – not abandonment and death.

Catholics are highly influenced by their Catholic Faith. How do we articulate compelling messages on MAiD? Offer

Jesus Christ and his message of hope: "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10).

Thank you to everyone who responded to our MAiD (Medical Assistance in Dying) survey.

We received more than 700 responses. It shows there is great concern over assisted suicide and its expansion.

Your responses were very personal. Many shared the helplessness they feel when a loved one is diagnosed with a terminal illness. Others felt at peace knowing that the Lord was accompanying them in difficult times. Still others want our Church leaders to take a more active stance against MAiD.

As Catholics, we uphold the dignity of all human life, from conception to natural death. Our secular world threatens this. The Archdiocese is developing an action plan based on the survey results, and we look forward to sharing the action plan with you in the coming weeks.
